

GROUP DISCUSSIONS

Although definitely not a forum for disclosure, group discussions present a fantastic opportunity to ensure that young people know that they are in a safe place for disclosure and that there are protocols in place.

Here is an example of the way that group discussions can be structured:

Peer Pressure

Whole Group Discussion:

People can sometimes persuade us to do things against our better judgement. What kinds of strategies do people like this use?

Small Group Activity:

Come up with three tips to help people manage situations in which they're being persuaded to do things against their better judgement.

Whole Group Discussion:

Share the tips and agree an order in which they might best be implemented.

Other example discussion topics related to the themes highlighted in Terriers and Eve's Story are:

Sexual Health

Healthy Relationships

Social Issues

Personal Health and Well Being

Moral Dilemmas

Life choices - Choice and Consequence

Child Exploitation

Personal Safety

Online safety

Bullying

All of these activities are suitable for groups of up to 30 young people but their impacts can be heightened if they are undertaken by a number of different groups, in different rooms.

If possible, responses should be captured on a whiteboard/flipchart or screen. These can then be photographed and returned to later.
